Saskatoon is saying good-by to Doris and Peter Bietenholz, who will be moving to Vancouver shortly. Among countless friends the two, a university professor and a French teacher, are leaving behind a legacy of active support of the arts and of cultural events. In particular, they were big promoters of the Museum of Antiquities, contributing substantial donations of artifacts that will be enjoyed by generations of people in Saskatchewan. They also belonged to the first group who supported the formation of the Swiss Club Saskatoon thirty-one years ago. Their genuine interest in the lives of people aided in giving the club that remarkable cohesion it now has. We wish the couple a good start in the new city. Doris and Peter will be missed.

Saskatoon hosted the Junior Hockey World Championship 2010 after Christmas and into January 2010. International sports events are a rarity in Saskatchewan. We people of Swiss descent were especially excited when we learned the Swiss Junior Hockey team was coming to participate. The Swiss reached a respectable fourth rank in the championship. But the highlight was the defeat of the Russian team by the Swiss players by 5:3. The Saskatoon crowd of 14'000 went wild. The happy memories will stay with us for years to come.

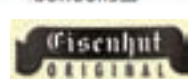

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Ouvrage Antoine de Courten

Les régiments de Wattville et de Meuron dans la 2e Guerre d'Indépendance des USA contre l'Angleterre

Le col Antoine de Courten traite de cette guerre de 1812-1814 au Canada en poursuivant deux objectifs principaux :

1. Le corps principal de l'ouvrage, le raid sur Oswego et quelques anecdotes proposent une lecture facile au public visitant les sites des champs de bataille.
2. Les appendices, quant à eux, sont destinés à donner une meilleure compréhension de la planification et de la conduite des opérations sur le front de Montréal durant l'hiver et le printemps 1814, tout comme de celles du front du Niagara l'été de la même année. Les aspects tactiques des batailles sur les rivières Niagara, Châteauguay, La Colle et Richelieu sont accessibles à tous. Le jugement de Sallaberry sur la Châteauguay et la bravoure des Voltigeurs canadiens y sont appréciés à leur juste valeur. On y découvre aussi que les ordres, les principes généraux de la conduite au combat ainsi que la gestion des risques et des opportunités ne sont pas vraiment différents de ce qu'appliquent les forces armées de nos jours.

Le livre est rédigé en anglais mais contient un extrait en langue française, très représentatif pour l'époque, des dispositions relatives à la peine de mort, au passage par les verges et au comportement général des troupes du Régiment de Wattville de 1795.
